

Indoor Air Filtration Progress

Indoor Air Filtration Measure: \$1 million in incentive funding to provide free air filtration units and replacement filters to residents in the AB 617 boundary





Project Plan Components

Project plan includes variety of **options, which can be implemented based on CSC support,** including prioritizing populations in most need

Potential Applicant Eligibility

- Reside within AB 617 boundaries and meet one or more of the following:
 - Be low income as indicated by enrollment in an assistance program such as CalFresh, Medi-Cal, WIC
 - Have children under the age of 18 or someone 65+ years of age living at the residence
 - Have someone in the household that is diagnosed with a respiratory illness/disease/condition
- Applicants can be residents, day care facilities and private preschools

Proposed Applicant Outreach Priority

- Outreach will prioritize highest in-need populations
- CBOs invited to assist in outreach and implementation of in-person events



Choosing Distribution Process

There are 2 options for distributing air filtration units to residents. Which do you think would work best in the community?

Option #1: Direct from manufacturer only

Pros:

Ship directly to residents
Fastest processing

Con:

No in-person opportunities to connect

Option #2: Flexible Distribution (Direct + In-Person Events)

Pros:

Some in-person events to pass out devices
Ship direct for those who need it

Con:

Potential variation in device make and model



Energy Bill Assistance

Utility Assistance

- Offer income-eligible residents of Kern County
- Community Action Partnership of Kern (CAPK) provides one payment in a 12-month period

California Alternate Rates for Energy Program (CARE)

- A monthly discount of 20% or more on gas and electricity
- Participants qualify through income guidelines or if enrolled in certain public assistance programs


Weatherization & Energy Efficiency
