[Main Room] Residential Air Filtration: Expansion to 2 Air Purifiers per Household

Funding in CERP:
\$1,000,000

Funding Spent:
\$546,315 (2730 units)

Funding Remaining:
\$453,685 (2270 units)

Building consensus: The District is proposing to **expand the Clean Air Rooms program** to allow **two air purifiers per household** (current program is one purifier per household). No funding reallocation needed. **Please add a sticky dot to the poster to indicate if you support this program expansion.**

- Several AB 617 communities have discussed supporting expanding the CAR program to allow for residents to obtain 2 purifiers per household
- In April 2026, District worked with an advertising agency to send out a second postcard mailer to **over 20,000** households within the AB 617 boundary
 - Since then, **582** applications have been submitted
- As previously discussed, District working to expand CAR program to include daycares, senior centers and additional spaces that serve sensitive receptors
 - Up to \$250K saved for this effort

[Breakout Session] Reallocate Funds to Support Passenger Vehicle Repair

Building consensus: The District is proposing to reallocate a total of **\$408,372.90** (\$270,000 from EV Charging Infrastructure, \$100,000 from Fireplace & Wood Stove Changout and \$38,372.90 from School Air Filtration) to support the Passenger Vehicle Repair measure.

- Residents receive a free emissions test to check for smog or emissions related issues and a repair voucher up to \$850 redeemable at a local STAR-certified smog shop.
- AB 617 Tune-in Tune-up program closed- need additional funding to reopen

[Breakout Session] Reallocate Funds to Support Electric School Bus Charging Infrastructure

Funding in CERP:
\$4,000,000

Funding Spent:
\$2,760,736

Funding Remaining:
\$1,239,264

Building consensus: The District is proposing a funding reallocation of **\$1,239,264** from the School Bus Replacement measure to the Heavy-Duty Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure program to support Stockton Unified School District's (SUSD) infrastructure needs. **Please add a sticky dot on the poster to indicate if you support this funding reallocation.**

- SUSD currently has 65 electric buses, including 10 funded through AB 617
 - SUSD's goal is to have an all-electric fleet
- At this time, SUSD needs additional infrastructure before more buses can be secured. **\$1.2M can support 15 level 2 bus chargers and associated electrical, power, construction, and engineering.** As SUSD currently has enough chargers to meet the needs of its existing fleet, this funding will support infrastructure in preparation for additional electric buses, which SUSD is actively pursuing to further reduce emissions in the community.
