# Lawnmower Trade-in + Tune-In Tune-Up Event

- District and Valley CAN hosted event on June 28th at the San Joaquin County Fairgrounds
  - **400** Stockton residents exchanged their old polluting gas-powered lawnmower for a new free zero-emission, electric Stihl lawnmower
  - **450** vehicles participated in the Tune-In Tune-Up smog repair event
  - **141** residents signed up for a free residential air purifier through the Clean Air Rooms program

# Heavy-Duty Truck Replacement Status

- **Funding in CERP: \$6,000,000**
- **Program Status:** District continuing outreach to school district, dealers, public agencies, and businesses, but challenges faced by businesses making transition due to cost, infrastructure, technology and regulatory concerns
- District still working with Kingsburg Truck Center and Stockton Unified School District (SUSD) to assess eligibility of fleet to participate in program
- As needed, District can work with CARB and SUSD on community-specific guidelines through Project Plan process

# Passenger Vehicle Replacement Update

- **Funding in CERP: \$6,800,000**
  - CSC supported reallocating \$2,000,000 during May 2024 CSC meeting and \$4,000,000 during March 2025 CSC meeting
- With recent funding reallocation, Valley CAN returned to hosting monthly weeknight workshops to assist interested applicants apply for the program

# Clean Air Rooms Update

- District continues to work with CSC and CBOs to conduct outreach and plan/attend events to sign residents up for program
  - Targeted mailer, social media posts, direct outreach to schools, churches, doctor offices, community centers and other community hubs
- Saw increase in applicants from direct mail campaign and lawn mower/TITU event, but there is still **over half of funding remaining** in CERP measure

# Clean Air Rooms Expansion

- Given **demonstrated need** and **alignment with CARB's incentive guidelines** for improving indoor air quality, the District recommends **expanding** the Clean Air Rooms Program eligibility to include: **daycare and elderly care facilities**
  - Commercial sized units, depending on size of facility
  - Up to 25% of funding (\$250,000) will be allocated to effort and remaining funding will be available to residents
  - District will continue outreach for residential/in-home purifiers
- To ensure funding gets out to community and meets goal of improving indoor air quality, District is proposing program expansion to reach more residents in Stockton boundary
