Welcome/Introductions		
Review Action Items	Jonathan asked for a status regarding the laminated boundary map to use for outreach and having a standard map to post online to allow folks to know where the boundary map is at. The Air Valley District team announced that the map is complete and has a QR code. This code can be used for those who want to share their contact info or use the tool to look up their address to see if they fall within the boundary.	Air Valley District to email the map image to the team to have it on file and use when needed.
	Douglas asked the difference between the old map	
	and the new one. Jonathan clarified that there is no difference, only that it is bigger in size. Douglas also	



shared concern with scam calls related to solar panels and was unsure if it was us or a scam. Jonathan clarified that there are not any solar panels on the project.

Espe added that solar is one of the issues they are working on because a lot of community members are being misinformed and thinking that these solar panels are free. It was advised to include a streamline message such as "AB-617 is funding from Carb or Air District" so that folks know who the funder is and what it is, when they see any materials. Everyone agreed that a funding statement is a good idea.

The team discussed a streamline approach process for community members to join.

Espe shared that they are using e-gift cards to value their community members time for participating in workshops, especially those that are long in duration. These workshops are broken up into breakout sessions that address a variety of questions. In terms of the write up of all this, Espe will share the breakdown of the process that has been utilized.

Espe to share virtual workshop write-up process with the team sometime next week.

The format of workshops and meetings were discussed with the team. Some expressed concerned with the recent COVID outbreak. There was discussion regarding the in-person meetings



	and the point of contact coming from the host. A vote was done, and hybrid format won the vote. Workshop will be promoted during the summer and in-person will be considered if COVID cases decrease.	
Leveraging the Mini Grant Program	Stephanie previewed the mobility infrastructure map on the Social Pinpoint platform and asked for feedback. This map showed where EV Charging, Bike Path, and Car Share Hub Locations would be suitable in the community. Jonathan emphasized the importance of sharing our work and resources with SJCOG to ensure we are not duplicating any project efforts. Stephanie shared that the Air District is in touch with SJCOG. An outreach training was discussed for the Outreach Subcommittee. This training will focus on sharing out using the mapping	Air District to reach out to SJCOG to see if there is anything that can be added to make the map better, and also to the City for their feedback.
