Passenger Vehicle Replace: Measure Progress

- Funding allocated in CERP: \$800,000
- During October 2023 CSC meeting, CSC supported increasing the funding available for a new plug-in hybrid or electric option to up to \$20,000 per vehicle with potential to increase funding to measure if needed
- Project Plan approved by CARB, finalizing contract with Valley Clean Air Now (ValleyCAN) and anticipate opening program in coming weeks
- In preparing for opening of program, we already see a demand in Stockton community through Valleywide program

With existing \$800K in funding, between ~40-70 residents can participate in program depending on the type of vehicle they choose. During one ValleyCAN outreach event, they typically will help complete ~50 applications and we are already seeing high interest in the Stockton area to participate in the Valleywide Passenger Vehicle Replace program.

- Planning to open program in May/June!



~140-240 Stockton residents to transition to newer, cleaner vehicles


NO: Do Not Add \$2M to Passenger

City of Stockton Bike Lane Project Summary


- Project Name: Stockton Safe Routes to School Safety and Connectivity Improvements Project
- Allocated AB 617 Funding: \$500,000
- Project Description: Funding for installation of bike lanes near several elementary, middle and high schools to increase safety and active modes of transportation
- Opportunity with Bike Path CERP Measure: Leveraging funds to support City of Stockton project, which aims to increase safety and active transportation through construction of bike lanes, missing sidewalk, curb ramps and safety features (installing high visibility crosswalks with flashing beacons) in disadvantaged communities

 - Proposed bicycle facilities per the City's Bicycle Plan





Bike Lane Project Budget

- Estimate for the bike lane installation includes removal and installation of striping, crack, and slurry sealing
- Bike lane installation per location:
 - Center and El Dorado Estimate:\$1,977,102.50
 - Hazelton Ave (Adjacent to Location 3): \$813,385.00
 - French Camp Turn Pike (Adjacent to Location 4/5): \$282,922.50
